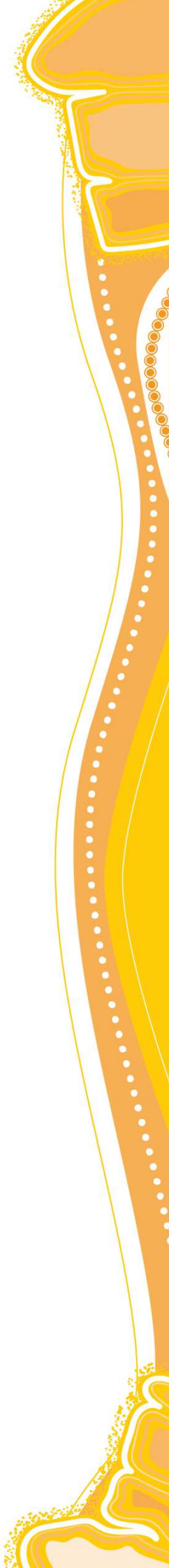


Service Map

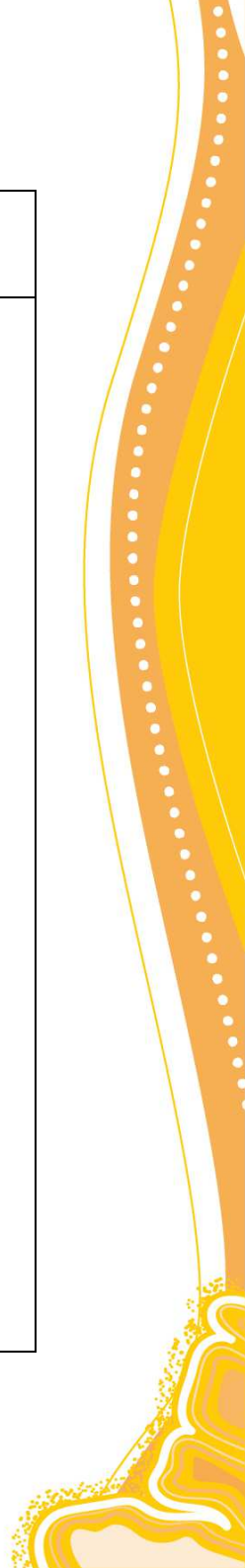

Through one on one support, counselling, education and activities emphasising men being present and engaged. Self care, positive relationships and community involvement are the main achievements of this program.</p>		
<p>Central West (United) Family Support Group</p> <p>Central West Family Support Group [CWFSG] was established in 1988 as a part of the Condobolin Lions Club. More than two decades on, CWFSG has become one of the West family services leading in this area.</p>	<p><u>CHILD YOUTH AND FAMILY SUPPORT</u></p> <p>There are two streams of service delivery. The Child and Family Support (CFS) stream targets families with children aged 0 to 12 years. The Youth and Family Support (YFS) stream targets young people aged 12 to 17 years or families with young people in this range. CWFSG provides two types of service. These are:</p> <p>Supported playgroups – providing an opportunity for parents to share experiences of parenting and for children to socialise, play and learn in a structured and positive environment. Supported playgroups provide a support network for parents and opportunities for parents to learn new parenting skills they may otherwise not acquire. For children, supported playgroups create opportunities for age-appropriate learning experiences and activities that help them become ‘ready for school’</p> <p>Parenting programs – providing parents with effective activities, information and coaching to assist them to build positive parenting skills</p>
